RE:	Mask Update in Long-term Care and Assisted Living

The COVID-19 situation continues to be closely monitored by our Medical Health Officers (MHO), Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC), Occupational Health and Safety (OH&S), and LTC/AL leadership.

With a recent increase in cases, masks for all staff in Long-term Care and Assisted Living must be reintroduced regardless of immunization status. All staff must wear a medical-grade mask when in a facility and anywhere healthcare is provided. This includes hallways used to move between areas when healthcare is provided, as well as any other shared spaces such as breakrooms. Masks may be removed temporarily when eating or drinking in breakrooms while also maintaining physical distance of 2 metres from others.

## **Current Drivers for Change:**

- Rising COVID-19 case numbers in Island Health impacting our Long-term Care and Assisted Living facilities
- In recent weeks, Delta has become the most common <u>COVID-19 variant</u> in the province, including on Vancouver Island
- The Delta strain spreads more easily between people and may lead to more serious outcomes than other strains of COVID-19
- All available means to limit the spread of new variants, including vaccination, wearing a medicalgrade mask and following current IPAC and public health measures are necessary

## Need to know:

- This change is effective immediately
- This change is for all staff regardless of immunization status

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- All protection measures (excellent hand hygiene, physical distancing where possible, active screening of all people entering and staying home when feeling unwell) still apply
- Additional PPE may be indicated based on <u>point of care risk assessment</u>
- Masks should be changed regularly, or if they get wet/soiled, at break times and/or after caring for residents who are on any additional precautions
- As before, medical-grade masks must be provided by the LTC/AL facility
- Mask use for visitors is currently under review and further communication will be forth coming
