Dear Family Members,

I have been formally notified that Dr. Mike Benusic (Medical Health Officer, South Island) has declared VCCC on **COVID-19 Outbreak**. This includes the following practices:

- All positive COVID-19 residents will be kept in isolation within their identified rooms for 5 days;
- •Once residents are post-isolation, they will be encouraged for wear a mask for an additional 5 days in common areas of the building.
- Testing of symptomatic resident cases will occur on a case by case basis and only by obtaining a Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test;
- There is a pause on admissions and transfers to and from VCCC;
- Each resident can have a single designated visitor but all other visitation ceases at this time;
- Screening and Rapid Antigen Testing upon entrance remain essential for all visitors to gain entry;
- Outings with family members are permitted but **discouraged** for residents who are asymptomatic;
- Vigilant sanitization practices and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be used by all staff and visitors; enhanced cleaning of VCCC of common areas of the building will continue;
- VCCC was planning a COVID-19 vaccination Clinic for April 27, 2200. However, Ministry of Health (MOH) is suggesting residents who are in isolation for a positive PCR test do not participate in receiving a vaccination at this time. Therefore, we will reschedule those residents.

We are endeavouring to keep all of your family members and staff as safe and comfortable as possible.
